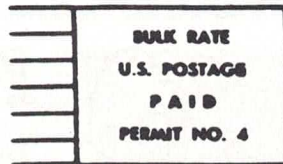

Two of Pewee's youngest international travelers are Kelsie Armentrout, daughter of John and Sara Armentrout, and Brooke Bowen, daughter of Lon and Beverly Bowen. Both Kelsie and Brooke were adopted through Holt International Childrens Services.

John and Sara had researched adoption alternatives for many years before finding Holt, a non-profit, Christian-based organization that places children throughout the U.S. and Europe.

While the majority of the children placed in homes in Kentucky are Korean, Holt also has offices in India, Thailand, Brazil and in the Phillipines. Their first effort is to place children in adoptive homes in their own country. Their philosophy is that each child in this world deserves a loving, caring home.

Kelsie arrived on May 12th when she was 4 months old. She is enjoying her new home and delights in following the family dogs in her walker.

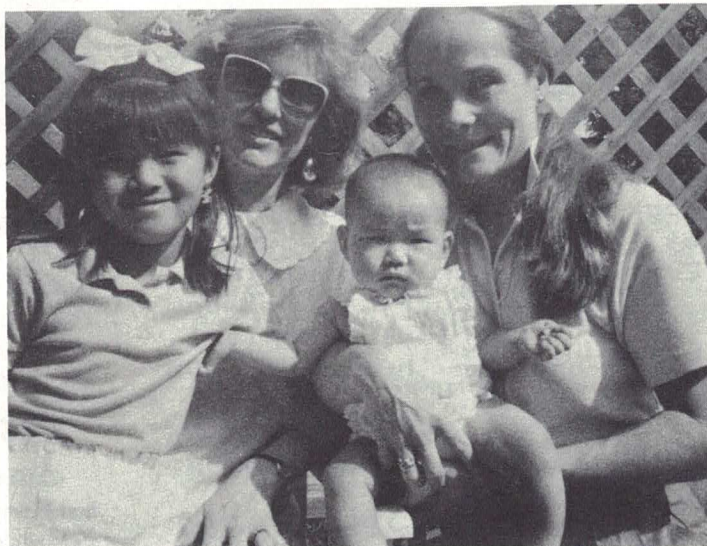
Kelsie was happy to meet Mayor Vivien Reinhardt at a

May 16 was a special day for Brooke and her parents; she became a United States citizen.

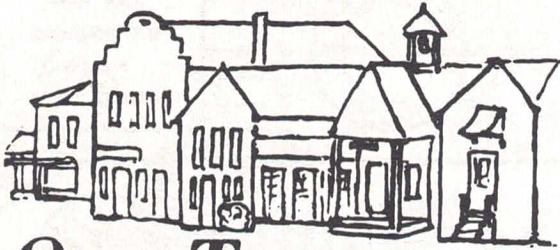

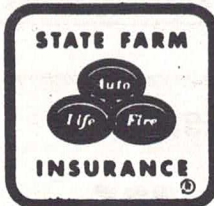

The Pewee Valley Board of Adjustments and Appeals will conduct a public hearing on July 26 on these two applications for conditional use of property within the City:

Gerald R. Parsons, seeking approval of a second accessory building (garage) at 106 Locust Lane.

Daniel R. and Mildred C. Lynch, for approval of a second garage at 314 Ash Ave. (This applicant also seeks approval of a dimensional variance to permit locating the garage less than the required 15 feet from a side property line, in order to preserve a large tree.)

The hearing will be a 7:30 p.m. in the Town Hall.

On May 24 the Board had denied a variance requested for the above property on Locust Lane.

Bob Bell, a real estate broker, can now recommend Pewee Valley first hand, since moving here in April.



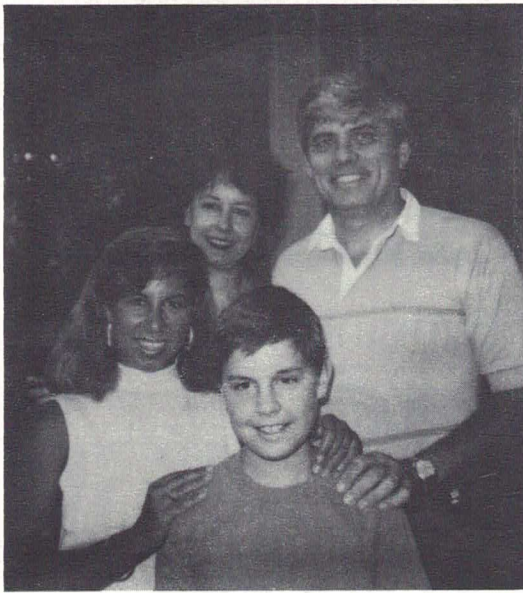
The Millers: Yvette and Fred

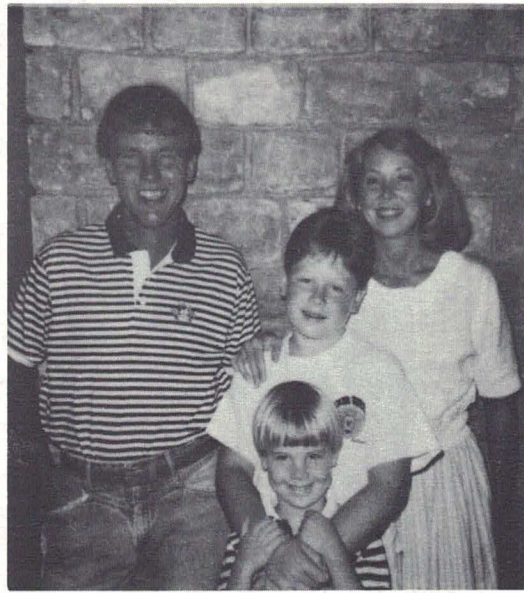
several years before going into real estate. He now has formed his own office - ERA Devine-Bell Realtors, located in the Westport Plaza.
