

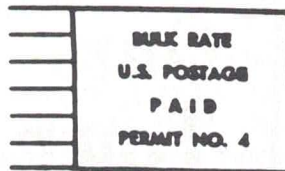

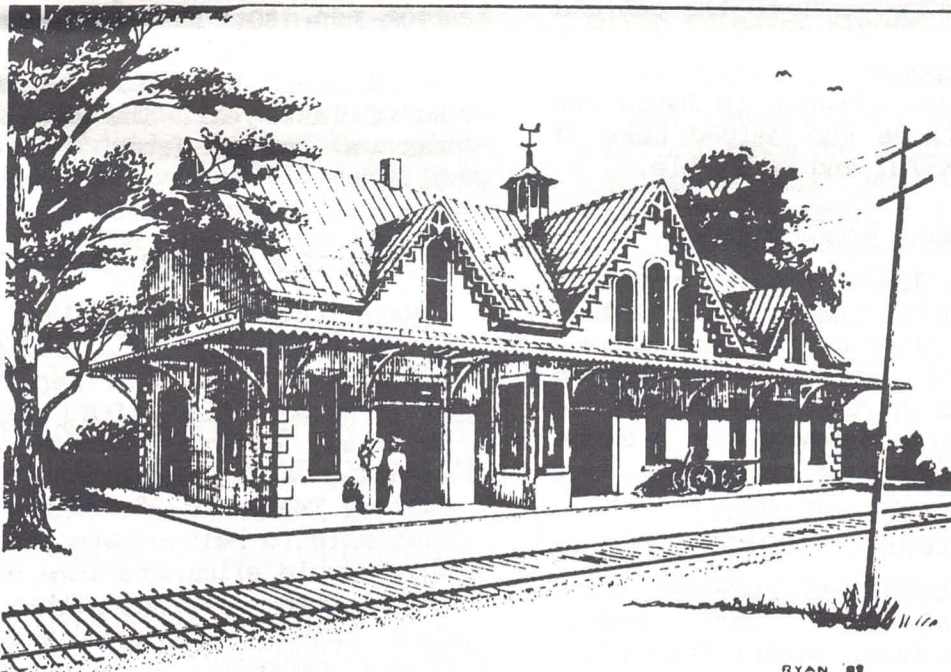

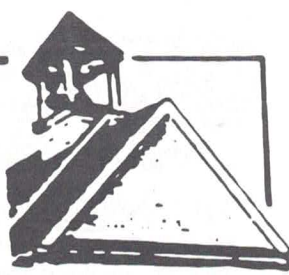

NEWS FROM JULY 6 CITY COUNCIL MEETING --

ANNUAL MUSIC FESTIVAL ENJOYED

Councilman David Funke received compliments and thanks for coordinating the City-sponsored Summer Band Concert and Festival, held June 19th on the shady grounds of St. James Episcopal Church. A good attendance of residents and friends enjoyed this annual event with some fun activities for the kids, steamed corn-on-the-cob and other delicious snacks, chatting with neighbors, and of course the live music. Thanks to David and to all those who helped make it so successful and enjoyable.

GARBAGE PICK-UP STUDY

Mayor Jim Kincer proposed discussion on the City providing garbage pick-up to residences. Councilman Peter Johnson agreed to research the possibility of paying for one company to provide city-wide garbage pick-up.

CORRECT PARKING

The Council has received some complaints about cars being parked in front yards. They will research Planning & Zoning regulations and County ordinances to see if any parking ordinances apply.

REST COTTAGE ROADWORK

The Council heard that several property owners on Rest Cottage Lane are planning to pay to asphalt part of the road soon. This will help eliminate the problems of potholes and excess limestone dust generated by traffic that blows on neighboring residents. City Attorney John F. Stewart proposed that the City work with the residents in using any culvert and encroachment fees collected from Rest Cottage Lane property owners to improve the drainage and/or shoulder work on the road.

ANNUAL AUDIT BID ACCEPTED

The City received only one bid for auditing the City's financial records for fiscal year July 1, 1998-June 30, 1999. The Council accepted the bid from MacIntyre & Wooldridge, who did the annual audit last year. The bid amount was a range from \$1,500 to \$1,700.

POSSIBLE QUIETER RR NOISE

Mayor Kincer has talked with Dean Hollingsworth, a field liaison with the U.S. Department of Transportation [DOT] Federal Railroad Administration, about creating a Quiet Zone in Pewee Valley. There is federal money available to help create the zone which would eliminate some of the train horn blowing within our City limits. He asked that the Council members review the information about creating a Quiet Zone before discussing it further.

Councilwoman Pat Payne reported that the Vehicle ID project on Sat. June 19 was very successful. 22 cars had their Vehicle Identification Numbers etched on the car's windows by Oldham County Police Officers. This qualifies the car owners for a 10 per cent premium reduction on comprehensive insurance, plus discourages car theft.

If residents would like for Pat and the Oldham County Police to schedule another day in the fall for etching VINs, she can take reservations for 25-30 vehicles. Call Pat at 241-8112 if you are interested.

CITY ROAD NEWS

Councilman Jim Marquardt reported that CSX is in the process of repairing several railroad crossings in the City.

He has ordered the speed bumps for Wooldridge Avenue. Councilman Peter Johnson has the speed bump warning signs ready to install as soon as the speed bumps are here.

THERE'S A LIMIT

The Council discussed the enforcement of weight limits on City roads and agreed that the City would like to become more aggressive in this matter. Oldham County Police Officer Wakefield will get the opinion of the County Attorney as to whether the police can cite trucks if their weight tickets indicate they are carrying more load than what is allowed for that particular street.

PETITION PRESENTED

A resident presented a signed petition from those opposed to the City annexing the property west of PNC Bank to the county line. A copy of the petition was given to Mayor Kincer.

ANNEXATION CONCERNS

The Council held off adopting an ordinance to annex more than 30 acres near Rollington Road. Since the Council's introduction of the annexation ordinance last month, several affected property owners have expressed concerns.

AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING THE ANNUAL BUDGET FOR THE CITY OF PEWEE VALLEY, KENTUCKY FOR THE FISCAL YEAR JULY 1, 1999 THROUGH JUNE 30, 2000

WHEREAS, an annual budget proposal and message has been prepared and delivered to the Town Council by the Mayor, and

WHEREAS, the Town Council has reviewed such budget proposal and made any necessary modifications, NOW THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF PEWEE VALLEY, KENTUCKY:
